# ADULT NURTURE & SPIRITUAL GROWTH

**Elder Scott Legwold** 

The year 2021 was one that included a transition from Elder Peter Zielski to Scott Legwold. We wish to sincerely thank Mr. Zielski for his work in Adult Nurture and Spiritual Growth. Scott Legwold was ordained in June 2021 and began to work each month with the Director of Family Ministry, Christa Schmeelk, to ensure our efforts were synchronized. She has been extremely helpful in all areas of Adult Nuture and Spiritual Growth. The items we were able to accomplish in 2021, during this period of COVID-19 pandemic impacting our efforts, are as follows:

- We ordered an Advent Devotional from Our Daily Bread for the congregation and ensured it was available by the end of November. We will seek this for the Lenten period in 2022 as well.
- We are hoping to re-start Sunday morning breakfasts again in 2022, including planning for such, and have potential guest speakers ready to speak at these events.
- We have researched the "Day Long Walk Through the Bible" conference/program and would be prepared to offer this in the future.
- We have examined and researched once again hosting future weekend opportunities and reviewed doing one again at Green Lake, Wisconsin. This included reviewing the Christian Writing Center at the Green Lake Conference Center there and adjacent facilities.
- We were most blessed to have Emerita Pastor Susan Vergeront lead a
   4-session Bible study for the Advent period in 2021. This was extremely well received by congregation members who attended, and we thank her greatly for leading this Bible Study.

- Pastor Vergeront will also be leading a Bible study during the Lenten period in 2022.
- Scott Legwold met with Pastor
  Morledge on December 7 to discuss the
  future of our Church Library. Scott has
  reached out to work with past church
  members who supported the library to
  see if we can gain a librarian again soon.
  He is also working to receive a book
  donation as well that was offered to
  Pastor Morledge by a church member.
  They are working to complete the
  transfer by the end of January.
- As the year 2021 ended, we have two adult Sunday School classes, one focusing on the curriculum for children's Sunday School and the other on David Jeremiah curriculum. The class focused on children's Sunday School curriculum will run until May 22nd. Christa Schmeelk is leading a book group for February and March; this will be conducted during youth group time.



As with 2020, much of the 2021 plan for the Buildings and Grounds Team was put on hold for 2021. However, some needed maintenance did occur. Maintenance was made to our air conditioning units in the sanctuary and in other portions of the building, and repairs were made to our security system. The outside lights received a much-needed light bulb upgrade to keep the parking lot safe for the congregation. The light bulbs and spot lights in the sanctuary were replaced in time for the Christmas celebrations. Also, plans have begun to propose a long range landscape master plan to be presented to Session sometime in 2022.

For 2022, Buildings and Grounds will be planning spring and fall clean-up days. Spring clean-up will most likely be in late April early May. Fall clean-up will be in October. As stated earlier the landscape master plan will hopefully take shape in 2022 for presentation to the Session. Lastly, Buildings and Grounds will be earnestly trying to **price a parking lot repair project** and present details and funding options to Session by early spring in the hopes of completing a project by the fall of 2022. Thanks to all who have been consistently donating funds for a parking lot project and for your patience while we work out the details.

### **FPC STEPHEN MINISTRY**

Stephen Ministry is a ministry of one-on-one caring that doesn't replace the work of the Deacons or Pastors, but rather "extends" it with our volunteers giving weekly caring to individuals going through loss, illness, life changes, and so many other situations where a caring, listening ear can help. Relationships last as long as they need to-some have lasted months even years.

Begun here at FPC in 2017, in our five years we have trained and ordained dozens of Stephen Ministers and have served more than a hundred individuals through the ministry. We serve both members of our congregation and individuals from our community who need a caring relationship. The fifty hours of education Stephen Ministers receive, along with continuing education and monthly support from fellow Stephen Ministers, qualify and support our dedicated volunteers.

2021 was a challenging year for us all, including Stephen Ministry. The limitations COVID instilled in meeting and providing our caring presented challenges in keeping our relationships intact and meaningful. But we did it. Eight Stephen Ministers provided care in 2021. 2022 will see three already trained Stephen Ministers returning to service, along with three new Stephen Ministers who will be ordained when they have completed their training. That will be a total of 14 Stephen Ministers ready and available to serve those who seek assistance.

Every one of us is blessed by our service to others. This ministry is virtually no cost/low cost to our annual budget, and allows members of our congregation to live their faith serving others as the hands and feet, and listening ears, of Jesus.



### BUILDING CARE AND MAINTENANCE

A friendly reminder – it is our responsibility and our obligation as members of FPC to care for and maintain the beautiful building that the Lord has given us. In 2021 and 2022, your pledged giving has not allowed us to budget many dollars for the care and maintenance of our building. As a church family we will have to rely on your generous hearts to provide the needed funds to support our building maintenance so it can serve us for many years to come.

In addition to general maintenance and care of our facilities, a key area needing to be addressed in the coming year is maintenance of our deteriorating parking lot. If you want to make a special donation specific to building and grounds, please contact Sue Gade in the church office. Thank you!

### 2022 BUDGETING APPROACH

The following factors drove Session's 2022 FPC Budget:

Decline in pledges: \$636,078 for 2022 vs. \$691,559 for 2021 (8.0% decrease)

Significant surplus in 2021 General Fund (\$85,375 carryover based on giving at 100% of pledged amounts, underspend in most all ministry areas during COVID, and \$153,252 in unpledged General Fund giving including some larger stock donations).

A return to a mission tithe – giving 10% of General Fund receipts to external mission.

In several recent years FPC has adopted a "faith budget." Given the uncertainty of Covid-19 recovery and giving, Session has approved a Ministry Plan deficit of (\$155,500). Session will be reviewing progress on a quarterly basis during 2022 to scale ministry investments up or down or resume borrowing based on actual results.

Detailed discussion and Q&A on the 2022 Budget shall occur on during a Budget Information Session on Sunday February 6, 2022 at Noon in the Gathering Space.

### FPC ENDOWMENT

During 2020 Session approved an endowment fund as a giving vehicle for general memorials and bequests. The endowment is managed by four trustees elected by Session (two Session members and two at-large members) with an eye toward sustaining investment in buildings and grounds and new or enhanced ministry areas. We encourage you to consider this endowment in your memorial gifts and estate planning.
